Rooted in Place: Arts, Heritage and Cultural Learning

A dynamic discussion between some of the UK's leading experts in cultural learning and heritage about how we use stories to engage learners in compelling narratives.

The panel will feature **Dr Penny Hay**, Professor of Imagination in the Research Centre for Cultural and Creative Industries, and Reader in Creative Teaching and Learning within the School of Education at Bath Spa University. Penny has worked extensively in arts education across the UK and co-ordinated the professional development programme for the National Society for Education in Art and Design (NSEAD). She integrates her experience in arts and education with participative action research, engaging individuals, institutions and communities. Her doctoral research focused on how as adults we support children's identity as artists.

The panel will be moderated by **Professor Briony Thomas**, Professor of Applied Creativity at the University of Leeds. Briony is passionate about diversity and inclusion, and the transformative power of creative education. She is a University Public Engagement Champion specialising in collaborative arts-science initiatives with schools and communities. Many of these projects have focused on integrating arts across the curriculum – both inside and outside the classroom – and making science accessible.
